THE STORY:

Changyu Pioneer Wine Company, established in 1892, is China's oldest and largest wine producer.

The company has embarked on a program of building European-style château, architecturally based on examples from Bordeaux, showcased in Berry Bros. & Rudd.

Château Changyu Moser XV in Ningxia was developed in consultation with Lenz Moser, of the famous Austrian wine family.



THE WINE:

A relatively serious red Bordeaux blend made in Ningxia, one of the best wine region of China.

VINTAGE: 2008

GRAPE VARIETALS:

90% Cabernet Sauvignon 10% Merlot

SOIL:

Lenz Moser compares Ningxia to the Mendoza wine region (Argentina) in terms of climate and soil.

WINEMAKING:

Aged 12 months in French oak.

TASTING NOTES:

There is plenty of Cabernet character, mature berry aromas such as blackcurrant and blackberry, a pleasant cedar, vanilla and oak aromas are blended and coordinated into the full-bodied wine.

The wine is solid with balanced and complete structure.

GRAPE VARIETALS:

100% Cabernet Sauvignon

SOIL:

Lenz Moser compares Ningxia to the Mendoza wine region (Argentina) in terms of climate and soil.

WINEMAKING:

Aged 12 months in French oak.

TASTING NOTES:

With its rigid structure and restrained fruit, this Cabernet calls to mind the Old World rather than the New. As such, it should satisfy both the traditionalist and the adventurous in every wine drinker.

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
